AME just wrapped up a three month factory alignment on **M/Y SANAM**, a 170' Palmer Johnson. The job scope began with precise strain gage

measurements, which then lead way to an optical alignment of the vessel's shaftline. Once the vessel splashed, a final laser check was performed to ensure the best results. "AME worked tirelessly to get us out on time and meet our very tight schedule," said Project Manager Donovan Benbrook. "The lead engineer and



service manager were always informative and kept our priorities in check. It was a tough project and AME remained positive and diligent throughout."

Vibration analysis and alignment may be AME's claim to fame, but

our fabrication department is just as good. Most recently, they were commissioned to design and build a custom layup table for fiber glass panels. The table, designed with interlocking joints that allow for it to be easily dismantled, was 10' x 16' when fully assembled, and was leveled using AME's Levalign laser



which rotates and takes geometric measurements.
