

Did you know that AME can also rebuild pumps? Recently, AME signed on to remove, inspect, and align pumps for the water works department of a major South Florida municipality. This extensive project will require elaborate



rigging for removals so that the units can be transported to AME's main shop. The AME service team will then conduct inspections and make necessary repairs to the pumps, which will conclude with alignments. Most importantly, the AME team will engineer new bases for the pumps, which will provide greater stability and support for the units.
